**Proposed Amendments and Additions to Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations Pertaining to the
Designated Subjects Career Technical Education Teaching Credentials Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation
Certification**

Final Statement of Reasons

Problem Statement

There has been no change to the public problem statement since the original submission of the Initial Statement of Reasons.

Statement of Purpose

There has been no change to the original purpose of the proposed action since the original submission of the Initial Statement of Reasons.

Updates to the Initial Statement of Reasons

Amend 80034.2(a)(6)

This subsection is amended to remove, “Commencing July 1, 2025,” as a nonsubstantive change because this is a retroactive date and the Commission has no authority to propose retroactive provisions.

Amend 80034.2(b)(5)

This subsection is amended to remove, “but not limited to” as a nonsubstantive change to more closely align with how this provision is stated in Education Code 44259.

With regard to the provision found in 80034.2(a)(6) & 80034.2(b)(5) which clarifies and makes specific CPR that covers infant, child, and adult CPR skills is necessary because the Preliminary Designated Subjects CTE Teaching Credential authorizes the holder to teach in the subject or subjects named on the credential in grades twelve and below and in classes organized primarily for adults, in career technical, trade or vocational courses. The Clear Designated Subjects CTE Teaching Credential authorizes the holder to teach in the subject or subjects named on the credential in grades twelve and below and in classes organized primarily for adults. Therefore, it is necessary for these credential holders to be certified in CPR skills that cover infant, child, and adults, because they are teaching in classes that include students whose ages range from infant, child, and adults.

This action is also repealing the following forms that were previously incorporated by reference: Application for Credential Authorizing Public School Service (form 41-4, rev 9/08) along with its related Instruction and Information Sheet (rev. 9/08) and Form 41-ECC (Explanation of Criminal Conviction or Pending Criminal Charge) (rev.7/08). *These documents are being repealed because newer versions are available. Currently, these documents are still incorporated by reference in other CTC regulation sections. However, it is the intent of the Commission to update these sections because these forms are superseded.*

Alternatives Determination

The Commission determined that no alternative it considered or that was otherwise identified and brought to its attention would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which the regulation is proposed, would be as effective and less burdensome to affected program completers than the adopted regulation, or would be more cost effective to affected program completers and equally effective in implementing the statutory policy or other provision of law.

The amendments adopted by the Commission are the only regulatory provisions identified by the Commission that accomplish the goal of ensuring that credential requirements accurately, effectively, and efficiently identify educators who have met high and rigorous certification standards. Except as set forth and discussed in the summary and responses to comments, no other alternatives were proposed or otherwise brought to the Commission's attention.

Mandated Costs

These proposed regulations will not impose a mandate on local agencies or school districts.
